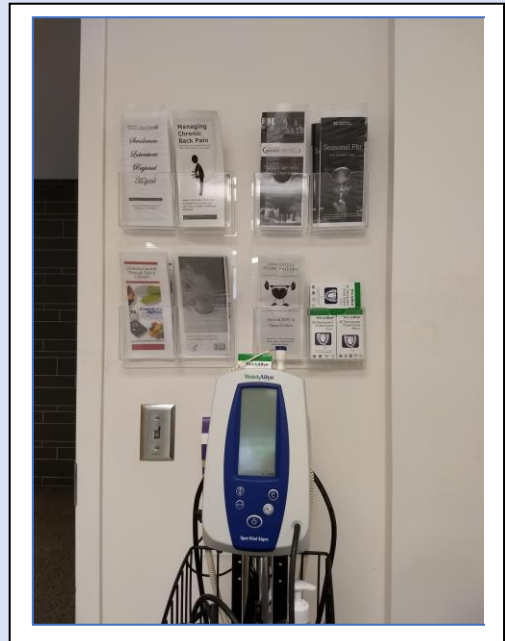
Project: Patient Teaching Brochures, Display Rack

Materials: Plastic brochure displays (4 or 6 slots), 2-sided tape, brochures

Cost: \$3.00 (each - pricey), try to find them at thrift stores

Time: 15 - 30 minutes (depending on number of display racks)

Details: Patient teaching is a vital component of (live patient/embedded model) scenarios. One way to approach teaching is to have students create brochures to fit the scenarios you are running, maybe as an assignment in one of the didactic courses that parallels your lab course. Students get to see their own brochures used in simlab and get to research some of the common conditions they will see on the floor. Some federal web sites also have downloadable brochures. Mount a brochure holder on the simlab wall, and insert the various brochures. As students prioritize their care and work in real-time, they can be assessed on how well the information is covered. If you use an HCAHPs survey prior to debriefing (see Project Blueprint 'HCAHPs'), the patient can comment on how well the information was described.
